Changes to the PFGM National Coordinating Team

In July, 2017, the Passionists' Provincial, Fr Tom McDonough, invited a number of people to form an interim PFGM Coordinating Team to coordinate the Passionist Family Group Movement across Australia

The initial Team met face-to-face in November 2017 and again in February 2018. During that time, conversations on-line and through telephone conferences were held. Ongoing, email and monthly video-conferences will be used for communication.

In February, 2018, Marion Stewart stepped aside from the team because of other commitments. Marion brought extensive PFGM experience to the Team. She had worked closely with Fr Peter McGrath as his personal secretary whilst he held the role of Provincial and remained close to him until his death. The Team is sorry to lose Marion but we thank her for her invaluable contribution and we wish her abundant blessings in her future endeavors. Subsequently, Fr Tom has invited the spouses of the remaining three lay members of the Team to join their

partners on the Team and each has accepted. This seemed a logical step as the Movement has always encouraged leaders to work in pairs. Therefore, we welcome Mary Morris, Gwen Winterscheidt and Michael Sullivan onto the Team. It was also suggested that the Team's title be changed to National Coordinating Team to better reflect its current function

International Family Group Day at Booval

It was a glorious sunny Autumn morning – truly worthy of the International Family Groups Day. Here at Sacred Heart, Booval, Qld., we celebrated with Mass, followed by morning tea for all.

How fitting it was that today's Gospel and Homily were centered on "*Love One Another.*"

Twenty-eight years ago, two young Passionist Priests, the Traynor brothers, came to run a mission in our parish. Definitely not the traditional *Fire and Brimstone* variety of the past. At each session, Father Brian and Father Paul role-played, sometimes in costume, aspects of God's command to Love One Another. This was the first we'd heard of Father Peter McGrath and the vision he had, Family Groups, which has since spread world-wide. He saw the need for it in his parish, where the parishioners would smile at each other during the Sign of Peace, and that was their only contact with each other. He wanted to change that.

This mission was the beginning of wonderful happenings in our parish. Under the guidance of Fr Brian Traynor, Gwen and Russ Winterscheidt, groups were formed, and Bonnie and Kevin Mulroney were our first Coordinators. How wonderful to have Bonnie as one of today's celebrators. There were a number of us here today who have been in Family Groups ever since the start.

We have created so many great memories together, not only our monthly gatherings, which have sometimes been adventurous, sometimes relaxed, sometimes week-ends away, but have attended memorable conferences, such as that incredible event at Meroo in April 2001, and also at Valla Park in northern N.S.W. where all the parishes took their own special F.G. Banners, and we were initiated into the Family Group Hug. At another conference, we took on the role of the Corinthians, and *loving one another* - taking appropriate food (dates etc.) to visit the various groups.

I give thanks today for Fr. Peter, Fr. Brian, Gwen and Russ, and everyone who got this wonderful movement going. So many lasting friendships formed, where we all care for each other between meetings, as well as enjoying each other's company socially, regularly.


