I experienced this with men in prison in Dallas, Pennsylvania. During my annual Retreat to the senior inmates I gave each of them a personalised letter from the Grace Cottage Passionist Companions. Each man went quietly to a private space in the Chapel and devoured each and every word.

A bit later, Chief Dan Daly (FDNY) spoke to the men of his work with the 'Wounded Warriors" from Iraq & Afghanistan. Young men missing limbs who train to run marathons on special equipment. An inspiration hit me. - Let's pass it forward. I asked the men if they would each write a letter spontaneously to a young warrior. The response was a unanimous, overwhelming YES.

It was a God moment. Each of them felt worthwhile with a task to bring comfort and encouragement to their wounded brothers. The letters were extraordinary because these men are never asked to draw on their kindness and goodness for other people. The question is, "how can we also empower others? How can we pay it forward?"
