Update on Fr Peter McGrath, founder of the PFGMovement

In the past, many of you may have had the pleasure of meeting or listening to the Passionist Family Group Movement's inspirational founder, Fr Peter McGrath. Like many of us, Fr Peter is ageing but he is also quite unwell and living in Aged Care in Sydney. A recent stroke has further compromised Fr Peter's health. Here is an excerpt from a Christmas message that was sent to our office on his behalf:

"We are ever grateful to Peter for founding the Passionist Family Group Movement (PFGM) back in 1972: quite a legacy for a priest who was told to "Go set up a church in Terrey Hills". He did so much more when he gave us Family Groups. We will be eternally grateful.

Sadly, dementia is taking its toll more and more. He is often aware of names and faces, sometimes memories of the past. As one of his brother Passionists said, "Peter is in his own personal Calvary. Please keep Fr Peter in your prayers."

Also, in your prayers please include PFGM members who are unwell and also those who have passed away in recent times, including Margaret Haines of the Ballarat North Parish.

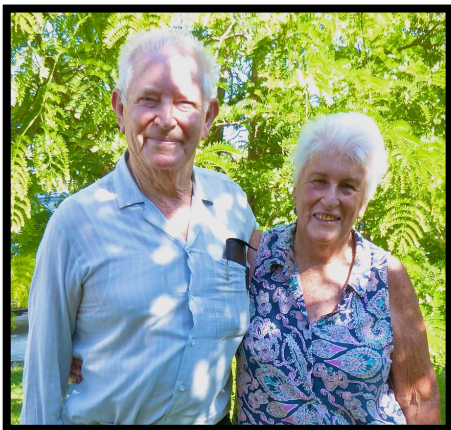
