

Meanwhile, the NCT is meeting regularly through web conferences and has a two-day meeting planned to be held at Holy Cross (Victoria) in early August.

#### **Family Group Weekends Away**

The Family Group members at *St Mary's*, *Rutherglen* in northern Victoria occasionally choose to go "off the beaten track", some towing their caravans, for their weekend away together. In April this year, they headed to West Wyalong in NSW. From that base, they drove on a long, rocky road to visit the unique, outback chapel of Christ the King on Farm 'Bolo'.

This circular chapel was built in 2008. It is decorated with beautiful frescoes including a magnificent domed ceiling. Rutherglen coordinator, Helen Briggs, said that her group were very impressed with this amazing place and enjoyed their prearranged visit very much. Earlier this year, one Family Group from **St Joseph's, Boronia**, chose to have a weekend away at Ballarat where they visited Sovereign Hill, the Botanical Gardens and the Art Gallery. Coordinator, John Faulkner commented that Family Group weekends away continue to provide the opportunities to have longer conversations, often one-on-one, with various group members that are not possible in just an evening or afternoon.

A number of other parishes' Family Groups have enjoyed weekends at the following venues:

- · Anglecrest in Anglesea
- · Adanac Christian Youth Camp at Yarra Junction
- · Stringybark Lodge camp at Gembrook
- Star of the Sea Guesthouse, Apollo Bay (This venue is well suited to older people or those who
  require disabled facilities. It has ramps and no stairs.)

When gathering at Cluster meetings and the various Family Groups' activities are discussed, it is sometimes suggested that we compile a list of places that Family Groups could visit on a day's outing. Of course, these need to be fairly local but here are some that may interest you if they are not too far from your patch.

Alowyn Gardens Yarra Glen: this beautiful property, right beside the main road but hidden behind the trees, contains seven acres of different garden areas that can be explored at a very reasonable cost, e.g. as little as \$7pp for a group. There are a number of covered areas with tables and chairs that can be booked and used for eating a BYO lunch. An urn can be set up at a low cost for you to make your own tea/coffee. There is also a café that can provide various hot drinks.



**Port Arlington:** A couple of groups have made good use of free Seniors travel on weekends by catching a train to the city and then paying for the ferry to sail from Docklands to Port Arlington. One group pre-booked the **FREE** RSL shuttle-bus (seats about 12-14 people) to take them from the ferry stop, to and from the Port Arlington RSL for lunch, before sailing back to the city and catching the train home.

*Herring Island in the Yarra River*: Accessible only by boat, Herring Island in the Yarra River is just 3km from the city. The park is a haven for nature and art lovers alike. Environmental sculptures made from natural materials reflect the island's tranquil setting.

BBQ facilities are available. A punt operates periodically

from Como Landing during summer.

This island oasis is a wonderful place to visit with amazing views of the city so close by. One Family Group opted to visit this island a few years ago in the off season using a member's boat: the many transfers to and from the island provided much merriment! (Buoyancy vests are a must!!)
